Our Club has been asked to hold the celebration of the delivery of the fire truck to the Village of Guadalupe, Mexico on September 10<sup>th</sup>. There will be a dinner at a winery, located in the Village of Guadalupe which will include Rotarians not only from Mexico but also the United States. The event will be attended by RI President Elect 2005-2006, Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammar. This visit is organized by the District Governor for District 4100 which covers Baja, Mexico. The event includes a visit to the Village of Guadalupe facility being completed with the assistance of the Rotary Club of Ensenada to house the fire truck and an ambulance. Bob Shusta has reserved six tickets, which are limited, for the event at \$35 each which includes dinner. Hotel reservations in Ensenada must be made soon. Three hotels are recommended with a cost range from \$58 to \$130 per night U.S. Bob has this information and will coordinate the reservations. The plan is to fly to San Diego on a Southwest Air flight on Thursday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, rent a vehicle and drive to Ensenada in time to attend their Club meeting which is at 8:30pm.
