Speaker Budd McKenzie – Trust in Education - Raising funds for Afghanistan.

A group of neighbors began in 2003 by raising funds to build a school in Lalander, Afghanistan. Budd became more informed as he started raising funds. The school opened in Spring of 2005. As support grew, so did the commitment. They are now providing education, health care, reconstruction and economic programs to several Afghan villages, including Lalander. The generous contributions of Stop Hunger Now and Reverend Billy Olsen and his congregation (located in North Carolina) enabled them to provide food and clothing to refugee camps in Kabul. They are also assisting Aschiana, a nonprofit NGO located in Kabul, by finding sponsors for street children. Sponsors provide \$20 a month to a street child, which enables that child to leave the streets long enough to attend school.

The Taliban had said no books, no education for women and no laughing in public. That all changed after 9.11.01. The cost was about \$25,000 to build the first school. After the first school was built, Budd shared his story with

local children. The children wanted to know where the playground was located – so Budd raised funds for a playground and they are now in the process of building a soccer field. The US has donated used soccer uniforms and soon they will have inter-village soccer tournaments.

During the project Budd witnessed the girls transform from shy and submissive to confident and strong.

The 4th through 6th grade was going to be eliminated in one of the schools, so Budd asked what the cost would be to keep it up and running – only \$300/month. It is now up and running with Grades 1 through 12. \$60 paid for all of the pens, pencils, books and supplies for 120 students.

Adult women are now also permitted to attend local schools. There is a mixture of young and old in the classrooms. When Budd has been approached for help he always says “Put it on the wish list”. He does not promise anything before reviewing the wish list and prioritizing what’s on it. It is safer to give loans to women and not to men. All items are shipped for free on military transport.
