Clive Worsley from Lafayette Town Hall Theatre

Thanks to Ed they have a full bar.
Theatre is a non-profit organization.
Also gave thanks to the City of Lafayette for their support.
Town Hall was built in 1914 as a place for people to gather.
1934 was First production and theatre is the oldest in the county
1950's is when classes started for children.
Theatre has 475 subscribers and his goal is 800.

Clive talked about the theatre programs. The current show running is "Proof" There will be a special price of \$10 for the July 1st, 2nd and 3rd shows. Discussed summer session for classes, workshops and camps. Class's help kids build self esteem and gives them courage to speak in public. Next season's opening show will be Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde which will be directed by Clive. The musical Scrooge will be back with more matinees. The Glass Menagerie and The Twelfth Night which happens to be the most produced comedy of all time, will round out the season. Clive mentioned the Town Hall works closely with the library with programs for kids. Last year April 1st the Theatre had a flood from a broken pipe. Clive was talking how the community came together to help, from fireman. Policeman children to help get the Theatre up and running again.
