Terry Koehne, Community Relations Coordinator for the San Ramon Valley Unified School District, spoke about the San Ramon Valley Coalition for Youth Safety and Development's Public Awareness Campaign, "Here Everyone Reaches Out (HERO)." The campaign, which was launched this spring, is in response to a recent survey, which cited that youths have trouble finding a connection with adults. He stressed the importance of working together to support the youth in our community and the need for positive youth/adult connections. These connections are critical for building personal assets and helping to prevent at-risk behavior in youth.

HERO targets adults in the community who are not already involved with kids and the ways in which they can improve conditions for positive youth experiences. The

focus is on personal commitment by adults rather than on programs and policy. The HERO Public Awareness Campaign will be delivered via printed materials, radio public service announcements, and television public service announcements. "No matter how small a role you play in a young person's life, it can be heroic."
